Green Zone

- Celebration assembly superstar

Yellow Zone

- Not keeping to the expectations in the Green Zone
- Verbal warning

Orange Zone

. Continuing Yellow Zone behaviour

- Continuing to interrupt learning
- Continuing to be unkind in your use of words and actions
- Refusing to do as asked when given a direct instruction

Sanction and next steps:

- · Thinking time
- Miss playtime or part of lunchtime play and complete work
- Parents informed by class teachers at the end of the day

Red Zone

Sanction and next steps:

- Continuing Orange Zone behaviour
- Repeatedly refusing to do as asked
- Swearing and/or using inappropriate language
 Physically hurting another child on purpose
- Repeatedly being unkind in your use of words
- Deliberately damaging school property
- · Thinking time out of class
- If the child has had thinking time in another class during that week, a meeting with the Year Team Leader can be arranged and they could consider either of the following:
 - · Missing a class outing or event
- Missing playtime
- · Parents/carer will be called (record on tracking system)

Grey Zone

Fighting with children

- . Deliberately hurting an adult
- Refusing to show respect towards adults and the school's expectations

Sanction and next steps:

- See a member of the senior leadership team who will decide an appropriate sanction, which may include the loss of playtimes or an extended time in another class
- Suspension or permanent exclusion from the school

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
