Celebrating Science Week at Malmesbury Park!

This week, Malmesbury Park Primary School was buzzing with excitement as we celebrated **Science Week**! Our young scientists rolled up their sleeves, put on their thinking caps, and dived into a range of hands-on investigations - exploring, experimenting, and, most importantly, having fun!

One of our exciting school-wide investigations involved **measuring the average height** of students. With rulers, tape measures, and plenty of teamwork, children gathered data and calculated the school's average height—practicing real-world maths and scientific thinking along the way!

In another experiment, children learned about **camouflaged butterflies** and how nature helps animals blend into their surroundings. By designing their own butterflies and hiding them around the school, they saw first-hand how predators (and curious classmates!) struggled to spot them. This activity helped develop an appreciation for how creatures survive in the wild.

Throughout the week, children tested predictions, recorded observations, and asked fantastic questions—showing just how exciting science can be. Their curiosity and enthusiasm made the week a huge success!
